### Good morning, families of Unity Junior High!

## This Week's Top 12:

1. Reminder! Preparing to Shine on this Year's State English Language Arts (ELA) **Exam!** We are now fully in test-prep mode for next month's ELA exam, to be administered on April 3rd and 4th. Students will continue to have nightly homework in ELA, including test prep assignments to complete three nights weekly along with assigned independent reading or creative writing assignments on the other two nights. In addition, students will complete weekly "scrimmages" or quizzes during class to check their stamina and accuracy. Reflections on these guizzes and goals for the following week will be sent home on Fridays: 3/15, 3/22, and 3/28. Select ELA teachers will also tutor students during lunch or after school on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Please contact your child's ELA teacher with any questions.

As a parent, you can support your child in preparing to do his or her best on the ELA exam by:

- 1. Ensuring that your child has a guiet place to complete homework
- 2. Discussing your child's reading with him/her. The following questions will be helpful in supporting your child in the thinking she/he will need to do on the ELA exam:
  - a. For fiction texts:
    - 1. What is the theme of this story?
    - 2. How are the characters affected by the setting?
    - 3. What narrative techniques did the author use?
    - 4. What is the author's goal in using these techniques?
    - 5. What inference can you make about the characters?
  - b. For non-fiction texts:

- 1. What is the central idea of the text?
- 2. What techniques did the author use?
- 3. What is the author's goal in using these techniques?
- 4. How does the author's word choice impact the meaning and tone of the text?
- 5. What text structures does the author use?
- 3. Discuss the results of your child's weekly guizzes and reflections.
