OUR STORY AND PURPOSE



FROM DAY ONE, UNITY SET OUT TO BE DIFFERENT.

Unity Preparatory Charter School of Brooklyn (Unity) was founded in 2013 in response to a troubling reality. Far too many students in New York City were getting lost in large schools that lacked the programs, relationships, and supports needed to help them reach their full potential.

From day one, Unity set out to be different. As an intentionally small, grades 6-12 school with a rich curriculum, strong extracurriculars, extended hours, and a dedicated team, Unity ensures every student is known, supported, and appropriately challenged throughout their development.



Over the past decade, Unity has made remarkable progress in realizing this vision. Throughout, we've remained true to our aim of serving students historically underserved by the public education system.

Among the milestones reached, we have:

- Grown from serving a single grade in our first year to full enrollment across grades 6-12, serving approximately 1,000 students and families since opening our doors
- Built a strong academic, extracurricular, and organizational infrastructure to support students from middle school to and through college
- Established two permanent campuses in central Brooklyn with our middle school in Bedford-Stuyvesant and high school in Williamsburg.
- Graduated over 300 students now pursuing college, careers, and contributing meaningfully to their communities

AS WE ENTER OUR SECOND DECADE, OUR THREE-YEAR STRATEGIC PLAN, BUILDING STRENGTH IN UNITY, OUTLINES OUR PRIORITIES DURING THIS PIVOTAL PERIOD OF GROWTH.



OUR AIM IS TO BECOME A LEADING OPEN-ENROLLMENT, GRADES 6–12 CHARTER SCHOOL IN NEW YORK CITY—AND TO SERVE AS A MODEL FOR STAND-ALONE SCHOOLS ACROSS THE CITY AND NATION.

THE STRATEGIES OF THIS PLAN REFLECT THE HIGHEST-LEVERAGE ACTIONS WE CAN MAKE TO ACHIEVE THE OUTCOMES WE SEEK. EACH STRATEGY ALIGNS WITH A CORE ELEMENT OF OUR EDUCATIONAL MODEL: RIGOROUS ACADEMICS, A SUPPORTIVE ENVIRONMENT, RICH EXPOSURES, AND ORGANIZATIONAL EXCELLENCE.

I. RIGOROUS AND RELEVANT LEARNING

Ensure students experience **rigorous, relevant instruction** every day to build the skills, knowledge, and mindset needed for **long-term success**.







KEY ACTIONS

- Strengthen alignment of our collegepreparatory curriculum across grades 6-12, including Regents preparation in middle school, AP courses in high school, and diverse electives in STEM, language, and the arts
- Bolster our foundational reading and math interventions during the school day for students below grade level, emphasizing customization and progress monitoring
- Expand our after-school and summer tutoring programming to provide additional time and support that ensure continued academic growth and success

TARGET OUTCOMES

- Exceptional academic proficiency and growth with Unity students outperforming city and state averages by at least 10 percentage points
- Strong participation, growth, and achievement in Advanced Placement in which 80%+ of Unity graduates complete at least one AP course; 35%+ earn college credit (vs. national average of 25%)
- Demonstrated, accelerated growth toward grade-level proficiency such that 75%+ of students receiving academic interventions and tutoring achieve 1.5 or more years of growth in ELA and/or mathas measured by internal assessments and/or state exams



II. SAFE, INCLUSIVE, AND ENGAGING LEARNING COMMUNITY

Foster a school culture where **students feel safe, valued, and empowered** to grow personally and academically.







KEY ACTIONS

- Refine our framework for promoting a strong, vibrant school culture through consistent expectations, positive reinforcement, restorative practices, and support for students' emotional well-being and personal growth
- Increase opportunities for student mentorship, voice, and empowerment, including mentoring across grade levels, peer mediation, student government, and student-led communication
- Deepen engagement among families, alumni, and the community through regular communication, inclusive events, volunteer and mentorship opportunities,, and celebrations of student and alumni success

TARGET OUTCOMES

- Increased well-being, confidence, and pride in one's success as evidenced by sustaining daily punctuality and attendance levels that are higher than citywide and state averages
- Achieve a 20% reduction in chronic absenteeism and behavior incidents by fostering a culture of belonging, consistency, and student engagement
- Increased family engagement, ambassadorship, and loyalty as demonstrated by growth in the percentage of families in grades 6-12 who participate in Unity's Family Ambassadors program by at least 5 percentage points annually



III. RICH EXPOSURES AND EXPERIENCES

Provide meaningful extracurriculars, career exploration, and real-world learning opportunities that inspire students and expand their horizons.







KEY ACTIONS

- Expand extracurricular programming to expand horizons and deep passions, including increased programming in athletics, clubs, and school-wide events that showcase students' talents
- Extend college- and career-readiness initiatives throughout grades 6-12, including increased college tours, career workshops, credential programming, and internships during the school year with community partners
- Broaden summer enrichment programming to provide acceleration opportunities that allow students to excel in their areas of interest-including summer camps, out-of-state and international travel programs, and job internships-through strategic partnerships

TARGET OUTCOMES

- Increased connections, motivation, and engagement with more than 50% of students participate on an athletic team or club each year
- Increased postsecondary success admission, matriculation to college and job-training programs, and persistence such that the percentage of students in grades 10-12 who successfully participate in an internship, fellowship, or credentialing program each year grows by at least 5 percentage points annually
- Increased experiential learning over 12
 months of the school year with at least
 60% of eligible students participating in
 enrichment programs-such as camps,
 travel experiences, or internships-through
 community partnerships that support
 academic acceleration and exploration of
 personal interests



IV. STRONG ORGANIZATIONAL SYSTEMS AND RESOURCES

Ensure Unity thrives through strong talent systems, internal infrastructure, and robust partnerships.







KEY ACTIONS

- Implement with excellence our systems for attracting, developing, and inspiring talent, including formal pathways for professional promotion, instructional coaching with regular feedback,, and ongoing training in alignment with each educator's goals and responsibilities
- Refine our systems and infrastructure as a non-profit organization with a focus on clarity, communication, and optimization
- Increase our collaboration with funders and community partners to provide opportunities for enrichment on par with well-resourced district schools and charter management organizations

TARGET OUTCOMES

- Increased skills, buy-in, pride, results among staff as evidenced by sustaining a staff retention rate of at least 80%
- Enhanced service, quality, and efficiency in which a net promoter score of 10 or above is earned among staff and families
- Expanded programming, impact, and profile whereby 3 or more three new partnerships are formally established and sustained annually with private revenues of \$1M raised annually
